Attendance

The school uses the following guidance with parents and pupils:

Your child's attendance is above 98% (Outstanding)

They are absent less than 6 days in a school year.

They are highly likely to achieve the best levels for their ability by the end of KS1/KS2.

Your child's attendance is 96% - <98% (Good)

They will probably achieve the best levels for their ability by the end of KS1/KS2.

Your child's attendance is 90% - <96% (Cause for concern)

They are missing up to 20 days in each school year – a full month!

This amount of absence will make progress difficult and reduce their level of success.

Immediate improvement is needed.

Your child's attendance is less than 90% (Serious cause for concern)

They are missing at least 1 or 2 days a fortnight; this is the same as over four months throughout their time at Cheam Park Farm Primary Academy.

Missing this amount of time will make it extremely difficult for them to keep up in lessons and make progress.

You need to take action! As a parent or carer, you could face a fine or court action.

School Uniform



- **Bottle green v-neck pullover, or cardigan – no logos other than the school's**
- **Summer dress in green and white check or thin green and white stripes**
- **Plain grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore**
- **Skirts and trousers must be of uniform style not fashion. Skirts must be around knee length**
- **White shirt or blouse**
- **In summer a short-sleeved shirt is allowed**
- **Plain grey, black or white socks**
- **Coloured socks and very short 'trainer' socks are not allowed**
- **Plain black shoes with flat heels - they should be suitable for school wear**
- **The school tie (available in the school office and compulsory all year)**

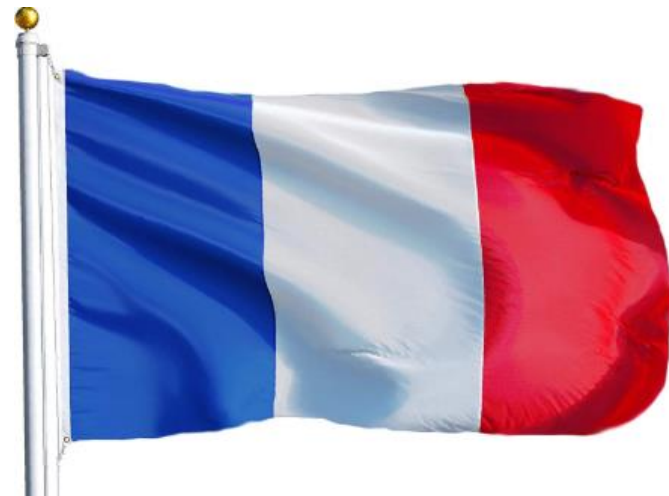

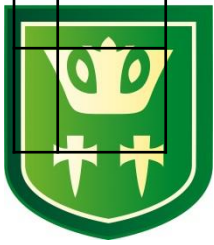
